# SAFE MANAGEMENT MEASURES FOR RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES INVOLVING LIVE PERFORMANCE ELEMENTS

performance elements	<ul> <li>A maximum of 50 persons are allowed to be involved in/support the conduct of the worship service. This includes persons on-stage, backstage or off-stage.         <ul> <li>No more than 20 persons may be unmasked at any given time (subject to safe distancing capacity of the premises)</li> <li>20 persons can be unmasked for singing or playing of wind/brass instruments. This is allowed only if all persons involved in the live performance elements are vaccinated</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Otherwise, unmasking for singing or playing of wind/brass instruments is not allowed</li> </ul>

Others	<ul> <li>No sharing of equipment (e.g. musical instruments, microphones, props)</li> <li>If unavoidable, equipment should be cleaned/disinfected before handled or used by others</li> <li>All technical equipment (e.g. camera, lights) should be cleaned at the beginning and end of each session, and between each user</li> </ul>
